

The Deep



Let your students enjoy a unique and memorable experience as you travel from the beginning of time and into the future. Dive into exciting exhibits including our breath-taking coral reef at the Lagoon of Light, interesting creatures in our Slime exhibit, some of our biggest sharks in Endless Oceans and creatures of the Amazon in the Amazon Flooded Forest.

Flamborough Lighthouse Bempton Cliffs



A lighthouse was first built on the Flamborough Headland in 1669 but was never lit. The current lighthouse was built in 1806 and acts as a waypoint for deep sea vessels and coastal traffic as well as marking the Flamborough Headland for vessels heading for Bridlington.

Bempton Cliffs provides the perfect setting for exploring a coastal habitat. The seabirds provide an up close experience. From the cliff-top path and our special viewpoints, you'll experience the sights, the sounds – and the smells – of life in one of the UK's largest and most important seabird colonies.

York - Jorvik Centre



An outing to Jorvik Viking Centre gives children the opportunity to learn about the real Viking settlement of Jorvik that stood on site one thousand years ago. Your pupils will have the chance to explore the Viking street of Coopersgate, see how it was discovered and investigate the evidence left behind. Jorvik offers a unique learning experience for your school groups, allowing them to see, smell, hear and even touch the past.

Eden Camp



Eden Camp is a multi-award winning Modern History Theme Museum housed within the grounds of an original World War Two prisoner of war camp. People of all ages visiting from around the world to see the story of World War Two re-created using sights, sounds, smells and moving figures to create a unique atmosphere that makes it feel like you travelled back in time to wartime Britain.
